Airport Operations Update

- **≻100,000 Pound Aircraft Weight Limitation and Verification**
 - Aircraft Operations 100,000 pounds or greater are not permitted. Aircraft must always be less than 100,000 pounds on the airfield (ramps, taxiways, runways).
 - Aircraft with a Certified Maximum Takeoff Weight (MTOW) above 100,000 pounds are permitted to
 operate if they submit, in advance of the operation(s), information proving the arrival and departure
 movements are conducted below the 100,000-pound limit.

(Gulfstream - G650ER / G700, Global - 7500 GL7T, Embraer - E190, Airbus - ACJ22)

How is information submitted?

TEB's 100K Aircraft Certification Form, online at:

Who is required to provide information?

Any aircraft with a certified MTOW 100,000 pounds or above.

Why is this required?

Accountability, ensuring compliance with Airport Rules and Regulations

Human Trafficking





Human Trafficking General Awareness

Anyone can be a victim, regardless of gender, age, background, citizenship (including U.S), or immigration status, and can be transported by any means, including airways, either alone or with others. The act of trafficking does not require movement, border crossing, or transportation.



Labor Trafficking Awareness

Indicators of labor trafficking — Using force, fraud, or coercion to force others into labor for little to no pay is considered a crime.



Sex Trafficking Awareness

Indicators of sex trafficking — Using force, fraud, or coercion to compel another person to perform commercial sex acts is an act of trafficking and this is a crime.

Under federal law, any minor (under 18) engaged in commercial sex is a victim of human trafficking, regardless of whether they are forced, coerced, or defrauded.

INDICATORS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

If you notice a person or group of people that have:



No control of travel identification/documents



No freedom of movement/ social interaction



Difficulty articulating reasonable/logical travel plans



A non-genuine relationship; particularly parent/guardian-child

Note: The presence or absence of any of the indicators listed above does not necessarily confirm human trafficking.

Call PAPD or the DHS Blue Campaign hotline if you notice or see anything that has Human Trafficking indicators:

- ✓ Report where suspected victims and traffickers are in the airport.
- ✓ Describe the victims and traffickers' physical characteristics, including their age, gender, clothing, etc.
- Describe what you saw or heard regarding human trafficking indicators.
- X It is important that you do not confront a suspected trafficker/victim to ensure your safety and the safety of others.
- ✗ Ensure you do not draw unnecessary attention to yourselves, suspected traffickers, or suspected victims.








Average Number of Birds Observed per Survey






Average Number of Birds per Guild Observed per Survey









January 2023:


- 72% of complaints received related to arrivals

Households within a 5-mile radius of TEB


