Construction Progress as of Friday, May 9, 2025



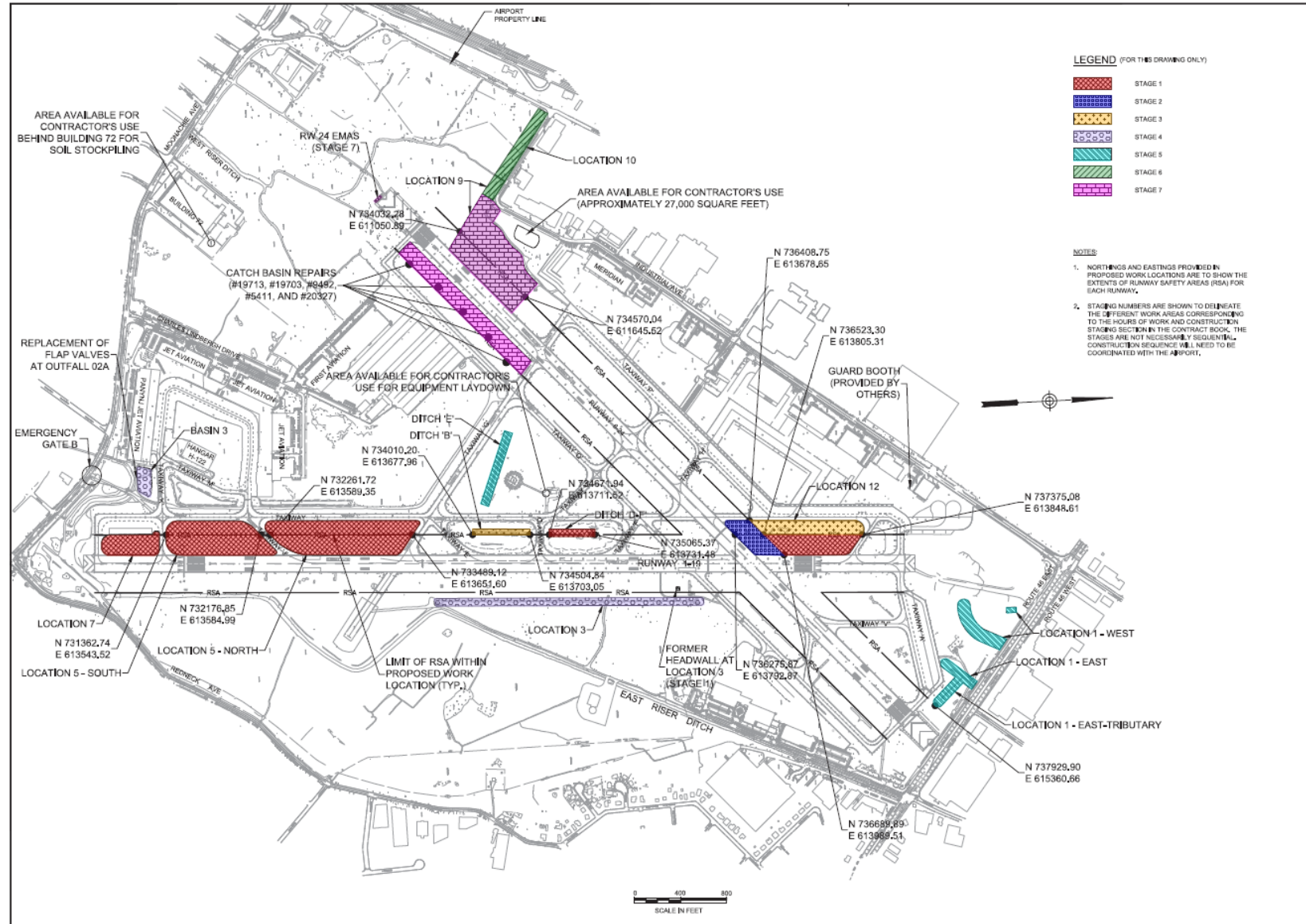
Ongoing Work:

- Completed installation of the upgraded Constant Current Regulators in the electrical vault – all lighting systems returned to service
- Held the final inspection on 4/15/2025 and submitted request for final permit
- Photometric testing scheduled for the week of Memorial Day
- General site cleanup and soil loadouts in the staging areas
- Nightly closures Q1/Q2 as needed for punchlist items

Storm Drain Phase 2

Construction Progress as of May 9, 2025

- Location 10
- Clearing and grubbing of existing vegetation complete
- Regrading to restore the drainage channel complete
- Location 9
- Similar scope of work as Location 10, including drain pipe removal and replacements
- Work began, to continue upon receipt of off-site material fabrication
- Location 1
- Began clearing and grubbing of existing vegetation
- Preparing to restore drainage swales and install new underground drainage systems

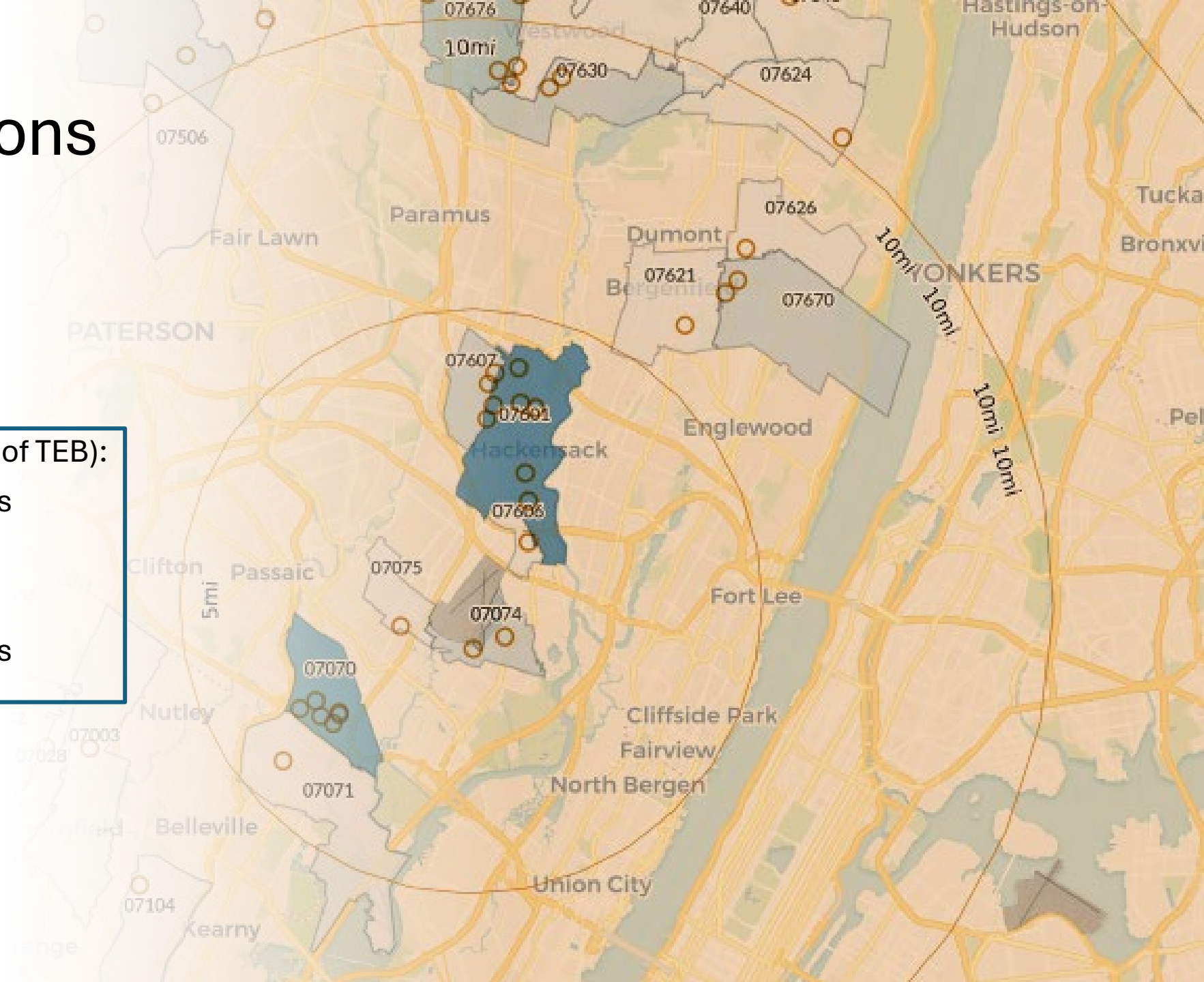
Complaint Locations April 2025

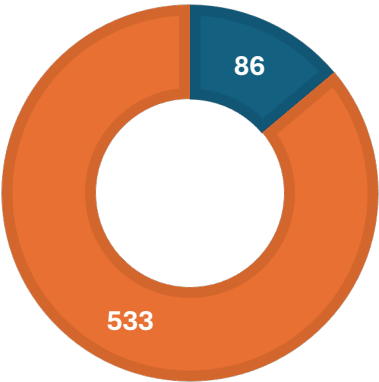

Runway 6 offset approach procedure	Review feasibility of an alternate Runway 6 approach procedure	Air Traffic Control (ATC) input is needed.	On hold. The Runway 1 procedure should move traffic from the Runway 6 approach and may provide the noise reduction sought.
RNAV (GPS) X Approach procedure to Runway 19 (Runway 19 offset approach)	Increase use of this procedure during daytime hours	Air Traffic Control (ATC) input needed.	We will be meeting with Newark Approach to talk about using the RNAV X approach during daytime hours.
Runway 19 approach procedures	Review feasibility of increasing aircraft altitudes at the Runway 19 Initial Approach Fix, UNVIL, from 2,000 ft. to 3,000 ft.	Air Traffic Control (ATC) input needed.	As previously reported, we're unable to raise UNVIL, however, we have some ideas about moving the fix and are considering the feasibility of those ideas.

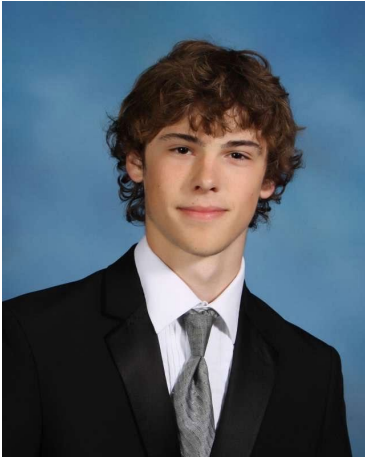

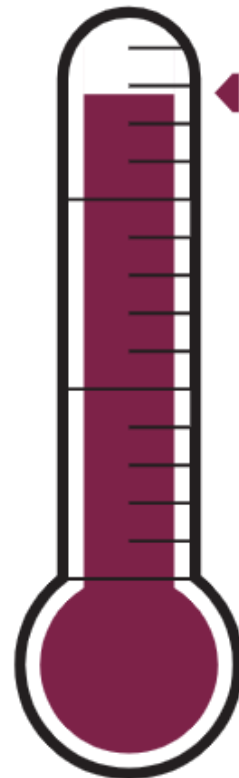
