

A Summary of the Teterboro Airport Manager's Meeting

Today's Manager's Meeting took place as a hybrid meeting in the Teterboro Airport Manager's Conference Room – 90 Moonachie Avenue, Teterboro and remotely via Microsoft TEAMS.

Welcome

Sherri Smith opened the meeting by welcoming everyone to the Manager's Meeting and thanked them for attending.

Airport Management - Statistical Report

Scott Marsh provided the following statistics report for March 2026:

The airport had a total of 15,349 movements during April. We pumped 5,797,942 gallons of fuel during the month and \$21,776,983 for the year to date. Fuel was up 11% for the month and 9% for the year to date. International arrivals were up 10% for the month and 5% year to date. The highest day for operations occurred on Thursday, April 30th, when we had 647 movements. We had an average of 512 movements for the month.

Airport Construction Update

Daniel Nunez provided an update on construction projects as summarized here.

Stormwater Drainage – Phase 2

- Construction Progress as of May 1, 2026:
 - A final inspection of all work was held on November 24, 2025.
 - The REO's Office is coordinating with the Contractor to complete remaining punch list work now that winter conditions have subsided. They will address issues related to the compost placed during seeding operations.
 - Work is on track for completion December 2026.

Beacon Relocation – Construction Progress as of May 8th

- The steel platform, stair, and rails have been erected.
- Waiting on the delivery of the high mast post and the decking for the platform.
- Final electrical connections and programming will follow.
- All work is scheduled to be completed by mid-July 2026.

Community Watch Audit Update – The Airport conducted 15 audits and inspected 114 items. We had 0 findings.

FBOs are reminded to encourage customers to make reservations with FBOs prior to arrival and to stick to those reservation times. PAPD will have two additional officers on patrol on game days. Airport Operations Report

John Kastens provided an update on airport operations as summarized here:

Airport Construction Project Updates

- Runway 24 EMAS Repairs
 - Two (2) overnight closures of Runway 6/24.
 - Thursday-Friday (May 21-22) from 2200L – 0600L.
 - Friday-Saturday (May 22-23) from 2200L – 0600L.
- Airfield Maintenance
 - Two (2) 1-hr temporary airport closures scheduled monthly (first Monday & Tuesday of each month).
 - Airport maintenance Activities in the intersection of both runways (e.g., grass cutting, electrical, etc.)
- Taxiway Q Rehabilitation
 - Planning stages and survey work for 2027 project activities.
- TAA Projects
 - Signature Aviation West Building 28 demo & ramp rehab complete.
 - Building 19 (Old Air Traffic Control Tower) demolition in progress.

Airport Gridlock Events

The airport had 1 gridlock event during April, which impacted the airport on 1 day, for a total of 55 minutes, reflecting 0.12% activity for the month.

Notable Occurrence

- Westchester County Airport (HPN) – Runway 16/34 Closure.
 - Four (4) 33-hour Runway 16/34 closures in 2026 (Tuesday 0930L – Wednesday 1830L).
 - May 5-6
 - May 12-13
 - June 2-3
 - September 15-16
 - Impacts to TEB to be expected with higher traffic volume.
 - Potential for gridlock events throughout this period.
 - Advise Airport Operations of any ramp gridlock or potential issues.
- ✓ FBOs are asked to think about what they can do as part of the airport community to help with gridlock. Upcoming meetings will be taking place on this.

ATCT Update

Traffic is anticipated to pick up and continue to be busy through the Summer especially prior to and during the FIFA games in June and July. ATC is anticipating increased traffic during the games and is requesting that FBOs notify them of anticipated traffic and encourage reservations in advance during those times.

FIFA and Sail 250 are anticipated to cause delays and increased traffic. Gridlock is anticipated to be an issue. Currently, reported daily numbers are coming in high, indicating FBOs may be overbooking arrivals. In addition, operators are not departing on a timely basis, and some are delaying scheduled departure. Traffic is not being spread out efficiently over the course of the day. This is causing issues for the tower staff who are left trying to coordinate where to put arriving aircraft while waiting for departures to leave. At present, on most days, arrivals are coming in at a faster rate than departures are leaving.

A Teterboro Airport working group is being put together, with the input of FBOs and the airport community, to brainstorm and developed ways to address traffic delays at the airport. FBOs present at today's Manager's Meeting all offered their commitment to participate in this working group and come together with Airport Management and Facility staff to find ways to find solutions to the issues brought up today.

General

US Special Agent Llona Brodetsky and Kevin Kozup introduced themselves. They are part of the FBI Crisis Center. They are the contact persons/liaison between PAPD, FBI, local authorities and the airport for the FIFA games.
